### English Language Arts

- **Pencils, Erasers and Pens**  
It is wise to bring multiple pencils/erasers to class each day. Pens may be used on final copies of papers.
- **Pocket folder to keep track of all handouts/homework/study guides/etc.**  
Various handouts will be given which should be kept and organized for all lessons.
- **Three-ring binder to create a unit collection of StudySync material.**  
To promote organizational skills, all students will create a binder of every single unit lesson in StudySync, our new ELA curriculum. There are **a lot** of supplemental worksheets and note papers for each unit that can best be organized using a binder and folders. The material for each unit can be removed and placed into a folder after each unit test. These materials can be used to practice/study for the PA Common Core test and the final course test. These materials can be used as a reference for future courses as well.
- **Notebook or loose-leaf paper (for inside of the binder)**
- **A journal or composition book for warm-up activities**
- **Internet access**
